THE GRANTS LIST THAT FOLLOWS, OFFERS EXAMPLES OF THE PRACTICAL IMPLEMENTATION OF OUR PRIMARY PURPOSE: TO ENHANCE THE QUALITY OF LIFE IN OUR COMMUNITIES. EACH GRANT DECISION RESULTS FROM A ROBUST PROCESS THAT IS OPEN AND ACCOUNTABLE TO THE COMMUNITY.

- Applications are received either from the advertised process or Trustees' knowledge of, and involvement in, the community.
- The community elected Boards of Trustees in Flaxmere, Masterton and Rimutaka, as representatives of the community, complete a thorough screening process, usually monthly, and recommend to the Trust House Foundation, what grants should be supported, and to what extent. This is, in effect, the most important part in the process because the recommendations represent the considered greatest needs of the communities.
- Trustees of the Trust House Foundation then approve, decline or request additional information on these recommendations.

The organisations and initiatives listed here represent the very wide colour and fabric of our communities.

This year's allocation of grants has, for the first time, favoured "Recreation and Sports" over "Community." The primary reason for this was the number of large projects that were completed for a wide range of sporting codes within our community that included hockey, netball and rugby, all sports that are well represented in large numbers throughout our region.

We continue to support many community initiatives and events and were delighted with the impact that Wings over Wairarapa, the new look Balloons festival and the Golden Shears had for the wellbeing of our community.

It is also important to recognise the many smaller grants that are delivered for community wellbeing and we are privileged to be in a position to offer our community the financial means to make 'our place' the envy of many regions in New Zealand.

Whilst decisions are often difficult, to see how each organisation contributes to a better community is an honour not taken lightly.

Netball Wairarapa is a regional organisation encompassing the three Wairarapa districts as well as parts of Tararua.

The goal of the Netball Wairarapa board is to rejuvenate and future-proof their regional facility in Masterton for the next 30 years and beyond. “The 33 year old netball courts and club rooms are well beyond their used by date”, says board subcommittee Chairman, Luther Toloa.

Two principles guide their vision. First, the redevelopment of grass roots netball is crucial to the Wairarapa community. Second, the facility affords Netball Wairarapa and the region's wider community to bid for and host local, regional, national and event international games here.

Netball Wairarapa’s steps for achieving its vision are:

1. Upgrade the club rooms – they are non-compliant and no longer fit for purpose
2. An indoor facility – this is the heart of the vision for the Colombo Road site; realising this vision will depend on the affordability of access by the netball and sporting communities as well as local residents
3. Resurface all outdoor courts to the most up to date and appropriate standards – as well as lighting for the option of holding outdoor games at night, and courtside shelter for players and supporters
4. Upgrade and reconfigure the car park – it is an important resource, utilised by three codes in the vicinity: soccer, rugby and netball

Netball Wairarapa acknowledges the generous grant made by the Trust House Foundation for capital development and part of the feasibility study. Mr. Toloa adds, “most crucially, the grant has given Netball Wairarapa a sense of faith that there are other stakeholders in the community, including the three Councils, thinking along the same lines. The netball community, wider sporting community and region as a whole deserves the standard of facility Netball Wairarapa has envisioned.”



The Wairarapa Kapa Haka Academy was established in 2015 to take kapa haka in the region to the next level.

Its vision is to inspire young people to strengthen kapa haka in the region's secondary schools, and raise the self-esteem and mana of young people from the skills and relationships developed through kapa haka.

Over three days during the April school holidays in 2015, Wairarapa REAP hosted the inaugural Kapa Haka Academy, with 43 students from seven Wairarapa secondary schools. The Academy attracted high calibre local and national tutors in Patu, Poi, Mau Rakau, Haka, voice and choral production, leadership and goal setting, advanced Maori movement and composition.

Following the success of the Academy, every Academy student was encouraged to work with their teachers to form or strengthen the kapa haka group at their school to perform at the Wairarapa REAP Kapa Haka Festival on 22 October 2015.

A core of Academy students also formed Wairarapa Ki Uta Ki Tai, Wairarapa's regional secondary school kapa haka group. They will perform at the regional kapa haka competition in Upper Hutt on 26 June 2015, vying for one of two opportunities to represent the region at the Nationals in 2016. The Wairarapa has had no regional representation in kapa haka at this level for almost five years. Wairarapa Ki Uta Ki Tai is tutored by Shari Taylor and Lily Arahanga with whanau support.

The grant funding from Trust House helped Wairarapa REAP and their partners make the Kapa Haka Academy a reality in support of their vision for youth and Maori achievement in the region.

Every year, more than 20 hot air balloons and their crews descend on the Wairarapa from all over New Zealand and around the world to compete at the Wairarapa Balloon Festival.

For pilots, the Festival is about showcasing their skills in reading winds and conditions to fly their balloons directly over competition targets, and taking away top points to contribute to the national competition circuit. For locals and balloon enthusiasts, it is a must-see, four day regional festival with a range of events, competitions and balloon spotting opportunities the whole family can enjoy at little or no cost.

The Trust House Night Glow is deemed the jewel in the crown of the Festival, held on the Saturday night at the Solway Show Grounds in Masterton. A fun, affordable event for the whole family, it is a spectacular show of light and sound. Tethered balloons glow like light bulbs to brighten the night sky in a show choreographed to music alongside family entertainment, food and a kids' zone.

Wairarapa Balloon Society Chairman Jonathan Hooker says the festival has seen phenomenal support from both the balloonists and local sponsors. “It’s a major undertaking. For the pilots to take time off work, visit the Wairarapa and partake in this four day event showcasing their talent, is what makes this festival. We couldn’t do it without their support. And we certainly couldn’t do it without the loyal support from local businesses and the grant funding from the Trust House Foundation.”

How to apply FOR A GRANT

If you are a member of a community organisation that wishes to apply for funding for your next initiative, here's how.

1. Complete an application form – grant application forms are available from any Trust House business, and can be downloaded from our website www.trusthouse.org.nz. You can also call us on (06) 370 0527 and we can post a form to you.
2. Submit a full application in hard copy – your application form requires some additional information; be sure to include all the documentation required by the Foundation. This helps the Trustees make an informed and considered decision about allocating funding. The application deadline for each funding round in 2015 is listed below.
3. If your application is accepted, the Foundation will advise you how to access the funding. If your application is declined, you are welcome to apply again in a subsequent round.

What happens?

The Trust House Foundation has five Trustees who are responsible for evaluating the grant applications and making the challenging decisions about where the Foundation's limited funds are allocated. They are also responsible for approving the Grant Funding Policies and for the reporting and compliance activity required by the Department of Internal Affairs. The Trustees meet 10 times per year.

Please note:

The Trustees recently reviewed and approved their evaluation criteria, systems and procedures for funding for community groups. These approved Policies for Grant Funding are available from any Trust House business, online at trusthouse.org.nz, or can be obtained by contacting the Community Support Secretary at Trust House on (06) 370 0527.

Applications may only be submitted to the Foundation in writing in hard copy.

Organisations may only receive one successful grant per year, unless in exceptional circumstances.
