# DIRECTORS REPORT 2019/2020

#### **Principal Activities**

Trust House Limited is a community enterprise that owns and operates business units in the Wairarapa, Wellington, Kapiti, Tararua and Hawkes Bay regions. Its shareholders are Masterton Community Trust and Flaxmere Licensing Trust. Management services were provided to Trust House Foundation.

Trust House's shareholding comprises:

- Masterton Licensing Trust 94.26%
- Flaxmere Licensing Trust 3.97%
- Flaxmere Licensing (Charitable) Trust 1.77%

The Group owns and operates business units including:

- Community Housing estate with 483 homes to rent and management of 10 Papakainga homes.
- Licenced premises hotels, restaurants, bars and bottle stores.
- A hydro-electricity scheme.

#### Results for the Year

It was a positive year's trading resulting in profit of \$5.77m. We are pleased to report an improvement in the performance of our bars and restaurant segment which has been difficult in prior years.

Cash flows (as detailed in the following table), and profits (detailed in the Operational Review) were sound and the financial position remains strong.

#### **Grant Distribution**

The grant distribution for the year was \$4.2 million (excluding donations sponsorship), and followed the traditional procedures whereby local community representatives make the initial recommendations for grants to be made to not-for-profit organisations in their area.

Trust House Foundation then approve or decline the recommendations. All the Regional Net Proceeds and advisory committees have established priorities for their communities and there is a high degree of openness, accountability, and consultation.

The various reports in this document record the distribution made to each community.

#### **Relationship with Shareholders**

There are strong links between the various Trusts and Trust House Limited.

There is an agreement with the shareholders that:

- Business plans will be presented in March each year for the financial year beginning 1 April.
- Reports on key events and trading compared to business plan targets will be presented quarterly.
- Annual accounts will be presented in July.
- Consultation will be undertaken during the annual appointment of two Directors.
- Discussion will occur on all major transactions and, where necessary, shareholder approval received.

#### **Auditors**

The Office of the Controller and Auditor-General has appointed Audit New Zealand to conduct the audit of Trust House Limited and its associated licensing and charitable trusts. Audit fees paid to Audit New Zealand for the year ended 31 March 2020 were \$102,053 for Trust House Group.

#### **Audit and Risk Committee**

The members of the committee are DB Henry (Chairman), L Griffiths, JW Kershaw and DJ Baskerville. The Committee met four times during the year.

#### **Use of Company Information**

The Board received no notice during the year from Directors requesting to use Company information received in their capacity as Directors which would not have otherwise been available to them.

#### **Share Dealing**

No Director acquired or disposed of any interest in shares in the Company during the year.

#### **Interest in Transactions**

No Director is interested in any transaction (as defined by Section 139 of the Companies Act 1993) or proposed transaction with the Company.



#### Conclusion

An otherwise strong year was slightly tarnished by the onset of COVID-19 in late March 2020.

Trust House Limited is a registered community housing provider and, as such, we are endeavouring to get as many of our tenants eligible for Income Related Rent (IRR). As at 31 March 2020 there were 158 tenants on IRR representing approximately 30.84% of our houses. Tenants who qualify should have more disposable income available to them.

All in all we have had a solid year to 31 March 2020 despite the impacts of COVID-19. Directors remain of a view that the company must remain financially strong so that Trust House Limited may offer tangible support to the communities in which we conduct business and generate revenue.

Our Grant Distribution this year was the highest return to our communities we have ever had. This is great for the organisations who benefit from these monies and allows them to reach their own organisational goals for well-being. Together with our Charitable Donations and Sponsorship we have distributed \$4.5 million for the year ending 31 March 2020 which is of considerable importance to our communities.

## OPERATIONAL REVIEW 2019/2020

It is pleasing to report that the Trust House Group has had another good year's trading with net profit up on last year at \$5.77m. This again raises the bar on what was a record year last year and provides management and staff at Trust House with immense satisfaction for the hard work and commitment demonstrated throughout the year.

The year's result would have been even better had we not lost 8 trading days as a result of COVID-19 lockdown protocols initiated by the government at the end of March. This resulted in all of our hospitality businesses being closed, the Copthorne Hotel and Resort Solway Park (Copthorne) room occupancy rate reducing to single digits, and all conference and function bookings being cancelled.

An increased reinvestment in housing and Copthorne occurred in 2019/20 which both tenants and guests respectively will benefit from in the years ahead.

Our strategic pillars for the current financial year are:

- Sustainable profitability
- Regulatory compliance
- Community well-being
- Systems and processes

The pillars assist in the advancement of our core purpose and further align our benchmark measurements to enable further enhancement of the communities in which we trade.

In regards to our various market segments:

#### **Bars and Restaurants**

This segment has continued to deliver improved performance which was built on the previous year's exceptional turnaround. Our gastro bar Farriers was a highlight and has become one of the region's most popular outlets. All other hospitality outlets performed solidly and further improvement is expected once the impact of COVID-19 reduces in the coming months.

#### Housing

Owning and operating 483 public houses with an average age of 55 years is paradoxically challenging and rewarding.

We are pleased to report that our rents, on average, continue to be set at below the lower quartile benchmarks (as per MBIE rent and bond statistics) and whilst rents in our trading areas have increased; we compare favourably for similar properties at both a local and national level.

Reinvestment in housing improved on last year with a total capital investment of \$1.20m. This aligns well with our long term strategy to annually increase the reinvestment in our housing assets.

Given housing is one of our principal activities, the breakdown of the financial impact on the Groups \$5.77m net profit is as follows:

As Wairarapa's largest community housing provider it is pleasing to report that we now have 158 tenants and their families receiving Income Related Rent (IRR). This significantly improves the wellbeing of families in our region as was a major factor in Trust House becoming a registered community housing provider.

### Copthorne Solway Park, Masterton

The hotel focused on the continuation of its refurbishment program with the indoor pool area and redecoration of rooms - areas of priority.

As alluded to previously, the fiscal performance of the hotel was negatively impacted by the lockdown protocols put in place during what is traditionally a busy time for the business.

The 2020/21 year will provide ongoing challenge for Copthorne as the tourism and conference markets react and respond to COVID-19. Measures put in place will allow the business to meet future demand if and when this occurs and there is cautious optimism based on current regional retail data that the Wairarapa is doing better than many other areas across the country.

#### Kourarau Hydro Scheme

The hydro scheme performed solidly. We continue to work through the engineering options available to deal with the flood damage that occurred at the top lake. Thankfully the damage had no impact on electricity production which was higher than forecast.



#### **Sponsorship**

Trust House Ltd and its businesses also sponsor a range of events, clubs, individuals and activities that align with our core aim and reflect the diversity of our communities.

This last year they provided \$245,150 worth of sponsorship back to the community.

#### **Health and Safety**

We adopt an 'our people and our stakeholders come first' philosophy to all health and safety at Trust House.

The Board of Directors receive regular reports and audits on our health and safety initiatives and we frequently identify our top risks and how each one will be mitigated within the frameworks of policy and process.

To get a first-hand understanding of the risks and challenges facing staff and tenants, our Board and senior management team visit outlets and houses to ensure that individual health and safety processes are being managed appropriately.

All injury incidents and near misses are reported at each Board meeting as this enables a transparent review process to occur in consultation with Directors

We operate and periodically review our company hazard register, and have quarterly companywide health and safety meetings with representatives from all business segments in attendance. The minutes of each meeting including actions arising are distributed throughout the Group for review and action where necessary.

#### Sustainability

We apply recycling initiatives throughout the Group and are committed to reducing energy consumption wherever possible.

Copthorne has also been awarded an Enviro-Silver standard, which requires that initiatives are in place to reduce energy, waste and water consumption.

We continue to work on our open fire replacement project and by the end of 2020, there will be no open fires in our properties with most being replaced with heat pumps. It should be noted that in 1999, we had 396 open fires throughout our housing portfolio, currently we have 4 left to replace.

We have recently replaced three of our car fleet with hybrids in an effort to increase our focus on sustainability, this strategy will continue as our vehicle fleet rotates.



#### **Our People**

We continue to invest in the training of our people and last year the Group invested \$51,000 in staff development. Concentration on customer service, cyber security, compliance and management development were essential areas of focus.

I am very lucky to have such a great group of staff to work with who diligently and skilfully perform their duties. The last few years have not been easy and I am very grateful for the support and loyalty that I receive each and every day despite some of the significant business reengineering strategies that have been implemented.



#### Reinvestment

Whilst the reengineering of our business model to focus on core business has been a primary focus, we continue to reinvest back into our existing asset base.

Last year's major investments were:

#### **Strategic Focus**
